

## **Extension of Application Deadline**

### **Dr. Kazumi Nishio Research Grants**

Dr. Kazumi Nishio Research Grants extends its application deadline until October 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023 so that students and faculty who are interested have more time to prepare after the new academic year starts.

#### **New Timeline**

October 30, 2023: RFP to be completed and submitted to [Info@AlliantEd.org](mailto:Info@AlliantEd.org)

November 15 – December 31, 2023: Committee reviews and scores all applications

January 15, 2024: Announcements made on recipients of funding

#### **Reporting**

Recipients of funding must submit a brief mid-year progress report by August 31, 2024 and a final report in early 2025 with data that addresses the outcomes of the project, lessons learned, any next steps, and a reconciliation of final expenses.

#### **Brief Overview**

The purpose of the new Dr. Kazumi Nishio Research Grants is to deepen the understanding of Asian and Asian-American mental health, to promote the mental health of Asians and Asian-Americans, and to provide grant opportunities for international research studies.

#### **Funding**

A total of \$21,000 in funding will be made available for 2024. The funding is divided into two distinct categories:

- Grant A: Up to three awards at \$2,000 each are available to current CSPP PhD or PsyD graduate students.
- Grant B: Up to two awards at \$7,500 each are available to CSPP core or adjunct faculty, CSPP-Japan legacy faculty and CSPP-Japan alumni.

#### **Areas of Emphasis**

Proposals must focus on Asian or Asian-American mental health. Priority will be given to research projects with an international focus.

#### **Submission Format**

Proposals should be double-spaced in 12 pt font, follow APA format and not exceed ten pages. IRB approval (if relevant), and any other critical information needed, should fit within the page limit. The length of the proposed project should not exceed 12-months, unless warranted. Proposals and reports should be submitted in English.

Project proposals should include the following criteria:

- 1) A statement about how this study promotes the mental health of Asian and Asian-American populations, research goals, relevant background, target population, methods, anticipated outcomes evaluation and dissemination plans for how the results of the effort will be evaluated and reported
- 2) Timeline of execution
- 3) Budget and justification

- 4) CV for all principal investigators
- 5) For Grant A, letter from the applicant's dissertation chair
